EXHIBIT FACT SHEET U-505 SUBMARINE

Exhibit Overview: The *U-505 Submarine* explores the compelling story of the vessel's capture, the technology of the U-boat, and what life was like aboard this German submarine.

> Guests view nearly 200 artifacts related to this National Historic Landmark and hear real testimony from the veterans who led the sub's capture. Interactive challenges allow guests to command a sub using the dive trainer, test their skills on the navigational and attack periscopes, send an Enigma-encoded message to friends, learn about the principle of buoyancy, and take a bunk in a recreation of the crew's quarters. They can also go on an optional on-board tour of the U-505, with authentic lighting and sound effects.

> The U-505— the only German submarine captured during World War II—has been a Museum treasure since 1954. In April 2004, the Museum took the unprecedented step of relocating the 700-ton vessel, which had been exposed to the elements for 50 years, to an underground, climate-controlled exhibit hall so that it could be preserved for generations to come. The project to preserve, move and create a dynamic new exhibit surrounding the U-505 is unparalleled in the Museum's history.

Cost: The 35,000-square-foot *U-505 Submarine* exhibit is included in Museum Entry. The
